What does Camp Atterbury do with the money collected from your recreational permits?

Studies and surveys help manage our herd population and dynamics to offer the best hunting experience we can while promoting a healthy ecosystem.

By law, the Sikes Act (16 U.S.C. 670(b)) and the Sikes Act Improvement Act (SAIA) of 1997, allow installations to establish fees for hunting, fishing, and trapping. These fees must be used for fish and wildlife related expenses on the installation.

Additionally, per DoD Instruction 4715.03 and 32 Code of Federal regulation part 190, collected fees are to be used on the installation from which they were collected specifically for the protection, conservation, and management of fish and wildlife. This includes habitat restoration projects, biological staff and support costs, and related activities.

This means that the money you pay is staying here at Camp Atterbury, and is used to help support the program. Your fees will help us create a better outdoor recreation experience on Camp Atterbury.
