MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: Garrison Policy 015 - Prohibition of Unauthorized Photographic and Video Surveillance on Atterbury-Muscatatuck (A-M)

1. References:

- a. Army Regulation (AR) 190-13 (The Army Physical Security Program)
- b. Army Regulation (AR) 525-2 (The Army Protection Program)
- c. Army Regulation (AR) 530-1 (Operations Security)
- d. Secretary of the Army Policy Memorandum (Army Policy for Unmanned Aircraft Systems on Army Installations), 1 August 2017.
- e. DoD Instruction 8500.01 (Cybersecurity)
- f. The Privacy Act of 1974 (5 U.S.C. § 552a): Governs how video recordings of identifiable personnel are gathered, stored, retrieved, and disseminated.

2. Purpose: To establish the policy governing the use of all forms of active (i.e. real time monitoring; e.g. AI-driven video analytics, sensor-triggered alarms, etc.) and passive (i.e. continuous, unmonitored record of data footage, logs, etc.) video and photographic surveillance for recreational or operational security and force protection.

3. The primary mission of Atterbury-Muscatatuck is to provide a realistic training environment for military personnel to enable Warfighter Readiness. The unauthorized use of recording devices anywhere on the installation poses a significant risk to operational security by potentially capturing sensitive activities, movement, procedures and equipment.

4. Foreign-manufactured surveillance devices often present network vulnerabilities. To reduce installation risk and comply with Section 889 of the NDAA, the deployment of unauthorized foreign telecommunications and surveillance equipment is restricted.

5. Applicability: This regulation applies to all military personnel, civilian employees, contractors, and visitors to Atterbury-Muscatatuck. This policy includes all forms of photography and videography, both print and digital, not explicitly approved for official purposes.

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6. Policy: The use of any device for the purpose of active or passive video and/or photographic surveillance is strictly prohibited anywhere on the Atterbury-Muscatatuck (A-M) unless explicitly authorized via approved written exception request. Examples of video surveillance devices include but are not limited to trail cameras, game cameras, dash cams (when the vehicle is unattended), Unmanned Aerial Surveillance (UAS), etc.)

7. Exceptions: Policy exceptions must be requested in writing in advance.

8. Units conducting training that involves the use of surveillance and/or recording equipment must receive authorization from the Directorate of Plans, Training, Mobilization, and Security (DPTMS) Director or Range Management Authority (RMA).

9. Personnel conducting official scientific or environmental research must receive authorization from the INNG J9 Installations and Environment / CFMO Environmental Program Manager. The Environmental Program Manager approved research efforts must receive final approval from and coordinate research locations with the DPTMS Director or RMA.

10. Enforcement. Any individual found to be in violation of this policy may be subject to administrative and/or disciplinary action, which may include the confiscation of the surveillance device, revocation of installation access privileges, debarment from the installation, and other legal actions as appropriate.
